Two thousand and fifteen years ago, or thereabouts, during the day before **THE** night, the people of Bethlehem went about their work and their lives, doing things the way they'd always done them, working, shopping, visiting and worshipping. The big difference was the snap census ordered by the Roman emperor, which brought people from faraway places into Bethlehem, for whom Bethlehem was their *home-town*, to register with the census bureau, and whilst there, they took time to visit members of their extended family and long-lost friends whom they had not met in many years, bringing greetings, updating family news, exchanging memories and swapping gifts.

It was not, "O little town of Bethlehem, how **still** we see Thee lie", it was more like "O busy town of Bethlehem, how nice to see you resting after a busy day".

As the residents of Bethlehem were resting, **God was at work.**

We live in a world of choices: we choose to embrace the science fiction of Star Wars *as if it were real*; we choose to welcome every new James Bond film *as if it had historical value*; we choose to accept the film "The Danish Girl" *as if it was normal* for all humans to **choose** their gender, to be male or female, whichever makes them feel most comfortable.

We live in a world in which we love Maggie Smith, her inimitable, acerbic quips and punchy one-liners, but her performance in the "The Lady in the Van" *with its brilliant insights into loneliness and age*<sup>1</sup>, does not stir our social conscience into action. We just love to admire her acting, and choose to ignore the message of the film!

On a dark night two thousand and fifteen years ago, God was at work coming to us as His Son, changing the lives of a young bewildered, confused, but obedient couple; , God was at work changing the lives of a band of obedient shepherds, and God was at work changing the lives of a community of obedient astrologers, changing each of them to believe in, and trust the Truth.
