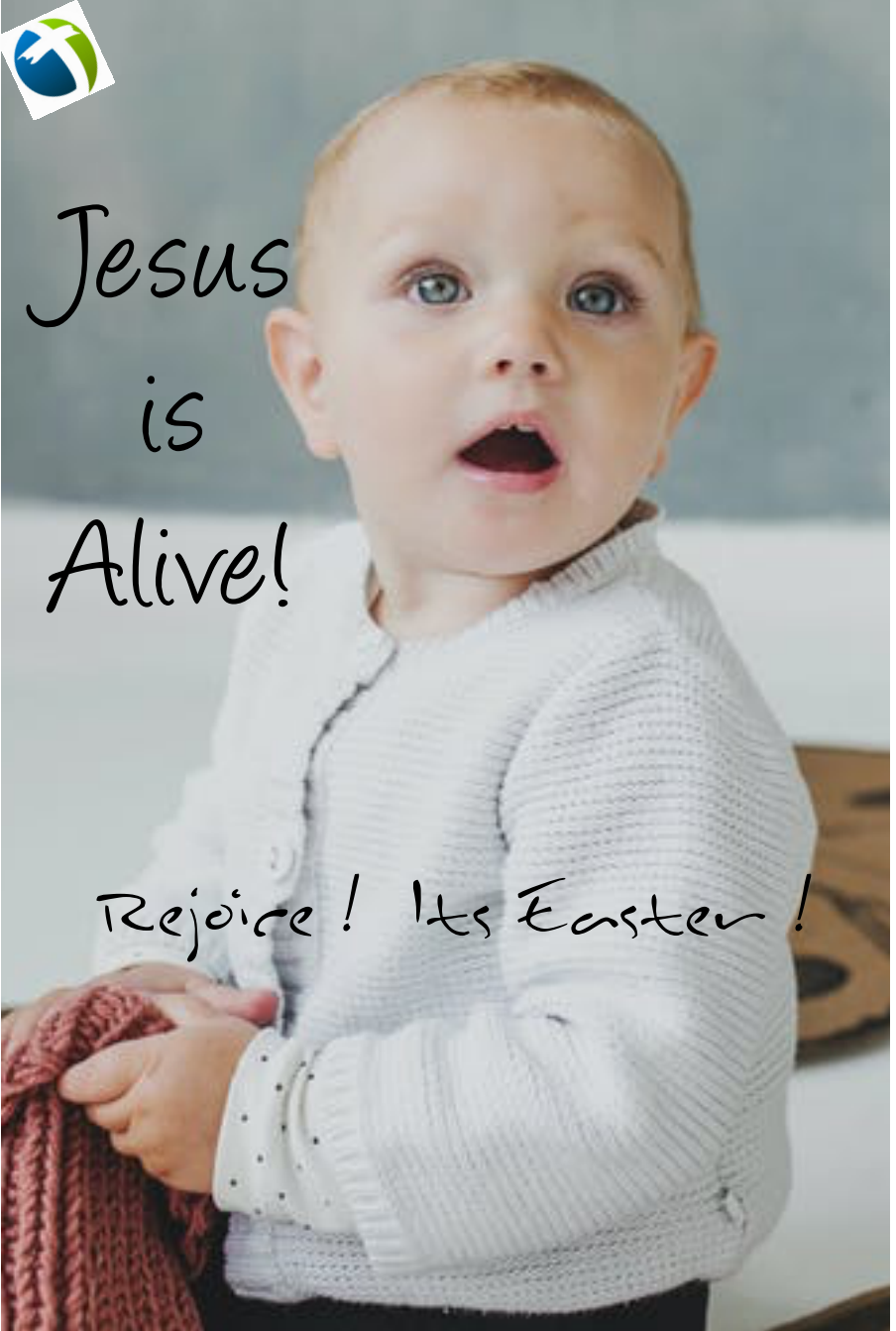

## **SCRIPTURE READING**

Early Sunday morning, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and found that the stone was rolled aside from the entrance. She ran and found Simon Peter and

me and said, "They have taken the Lord's body out of the tomb, and I don't know where they have put him!" We ran to the tomb to see; I outran Peter and got there first, and stooped and looked in and saw the linen cloth lying there, but I didn't go in. Then Simon Peter arrived and went on inside. He also noticed the cloth lying there, while the swath that had covered Jesus' head was rolled up in a bundle and was lying at the side. Then I went in too, and saw, and believed that he had risen - for until then we hadn't realised the Scriptures said, He would come to life again!

## **SCRIPTURE READING**

Mary Magdalene found the disciples and told them, "I have seen the Lord!" Then she gave them his message ("go find my brothers and tell them that I ascend to my Father and your Father, my God and your God.")

That evening the disciples were meeting behind locked doors, in fear of the Jewish leaders, when suddenly Jesus was standing there among them! After greeting them, He showed them his hands and side. And how wonderful was their joy as they saw their Lord! He spoke to them again and said, "As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." Then he breathed on them and told them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, they are forgiven. If you refuse to forgive them, they remain unforgiven."

One of the disciples, Thomas, "The Twin," was not there at the time with the others. When they kept telling him, "We have seen the Lord," he replied, "I won't believe it unless I see the nail wounds in his hands—and put my fingers into them—and place my hand into his side."

Eight days later the disciples were together again, and this time Thomas was with them. The doors were locked; but suddenly, as before, Jesus was standing among them and greeting them.



Then he said to Thomas, “Put your finger into my hands. Put your hand into my side. Don’t be faithless any longer. Believe!”

“My Lord and my God!” Thomas said.

Then Jesus told him, “You believe because you have seen me. But blessed are those who haven’t seen me and believe anyway.”

Jesus’ disciples saw Him do many other miracles besides the ones told about in this book, but these are recorded so that you will believe that He is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that believing in him you will have life.

## **HYMN**      **Because He Lives**

### **MESSAGE**

You must have heard it said, “The cross is the universal symbol of Christianity.” Those who created it, would have marvelled at its simplicity of design, which yielded *excruciating*<sup>1</sup> pain before eventual death. Strange don’t you think that an implement of torture the human race has ever

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<sup>1</sup> from the late 16th century: Latin *excruciat*- ‘tormented’, from the verb *excruciare* (based on *crux*, *cruc*- ‘a cross’). i.e. **Tormented by the Cross**

devised<sup>2</sup>, the Cross could be a symbol of hope?

God is sovereign over all things, including all that is evil. The simple design of the cross, one horizontal beam, the other vertical; together it conveys everything God wants to say to us, without a word being spoken:

The vertical beam is God's hand reaching down to us; we can never "reach" God, so He reaches down.

The horizontal beam is God's warm welcoming embrace.

The intersection of the horizontal and vertical beams is the CROSS, where God's Son, our Christ, stepped in, to rescue, validate and guarantee our relationship with the Father.

The horizontal beam reminds us of Christ's surrender of life unto death, because it was on either side of the horizontal beam, nails were driven into Jesus' hand. The vertical beam

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<sup>2</sup> Probably originating with the Assyrians and Babylonians, it was used systematically by the Persians in the 6th century BC. Alexander the Great brought it from there to the eastern Mediterranean countries in the 4th century BC, and the Phoenicians introduced it to Rome in the 3rd century BC. *(from website of The National Centre for Biotechnology Information)*

reminds us of God's pain of separation from us, so He reaches down to us!

It is interesting that at the intersection of the cross, Christ looks up to the Father, looks down to draw us up in to the Father's presence, and looks across the horizontal beam, past the nails that hung Him there, across to the world, for whom He gave His life, knowing that His life was not lived in vain!

I have often felt that the open grave should be the symbol of our Christian faith as it symbolises victory of life over death, but I also believe the cross reminds us of God's love and Christ's suffering, the h-u-g-e emotional cost, the Father and the Son paid to free me from eternal death, to eternal life.

The world says, life ends with death. Our God says, only through death comes life!

Its your turn! Which will you believe and set as your standard for life?
